Follow the instructions at the top of the plant entry form to enter the appropriate group, class, and name for each plant and submit your form(s) electronically.. **Deadline for electronically submitted forms is Wednesday, April 25.**

For those of you who do not have access to a computer, printed copies of the above forms will be available at the meeting on April 15. **Deadline for all other plant entries is Thursday, April 26 by 7 P.M.**

YOUR ARTWORK AND PHOTOGRAPHY – We invite you (or any talented person you know) to submit entries of original artwork or photography featuring orchids for this special display. Geof Gould, who is organizing the art and photography exhibit, is accepting entry forms until **Monday, April 16**. Print the "Call for Entries" form on our website under "Annual Show" or request a printed copy by calling Geof at (607)-757-0499. On **Thursday, April 26 at 3:30 P.M.**, Geof will begin receiving art and photo entries in the Center Court of Oakdale Mall.

GROWING ORCHIDS ELSEWHERE

I usually have an opportunity to visit some relatives and friends in Lima, Peru during their spring season almost every year. Lima is a large city of eight million people, located near the Pacific Ocean. The climatic conditions are quite favorable year-round and marine breezes reach inland every evening. These conditions offer opportunities to grow orchids as houseplants. In our trips I manage to take small seedlings for my brother-in-law who grows some orchids and other plants. I see these seedlings develop into vigorous plants in our following visits. My brother-in-law, Francisco Zapata is a hobbyist who has a mixed collection of local species, phalaenopsis hybrids, cattleyas and a series of ever-blooming epidendrums. All I can do, while I am there visiting is admire these plants. Two of the images shown below (*Phragmipedium caudatum* and phalaenopsis Carmela's Pixie) testify to his ability as a grower. I am certain that if I had those plants in these conditions I would earn many awards at our local show.
